I hope this Command Status Report finds you well and safe.

I would like to take note that we hope that all our members in Texas (R3) are safe and well from the weekend flooding. We continue the progress moving forward to strengthen STARFLEET into the future is going strong with new Committees and new processes. We are working hard going forward for the benefit of SFI with a focus on "new blood". Here is an update on where we are:

As of today, The Administration has these new, completed or is still progressing on:

- We hope to see you August 1-3 in Houston TX for IC 2025. We have filled our room block but you can still reserve a room and other reg/meals up to July 20th. We are still seeking bids for IC 2026. If no bids that meet the frugal attributes of our membership the ECAB meeting will be held via Zoom or Google meet.
- We are in the active process of updating the Style Guide/Intellectual Property Usage and the Member handbook. Both are almost complete and will be made available to all as soon as they are formatted.
- I have asked David Yee our Compliance Officer to begin the creation of an Intellectual Property Course. This will be for any member but will focus on RC's, CO's, XO's, Comms, and any other leadership member in our organization that creates digital or materials that promote SFI and the Franchise. Its goal is to educate all on how to use our Fleet Logo's and the IP of the Franchise holders. Mr. Yee will be stepping down to deal with family issue and we will be posting a new requisition to the VR site soon.
- We have a new CFO and that process is complete. We have just put out a requisition for the DCFO to add to the Finance Department. We are collaborating with a new CPA and will begin the process of getting our documents ready for the Tax process due by October.
- We are now in the election cycle for a new Commander STARFLEET. Note that the Facebook group Members Only will not have any election materials. All announcements and materials will be made available on the Facebook Business Only Group or by direct Web site that is in process. There is only one slate that came forward during the nomination process and we congratulate the Case/Sams team on moving to a VOC.
- We have appointed a new DANT of the SFMC. FADM Michael Mallote has assumed the posting and will take the SFMC to a new level.

More Work Ongoing:

- The Chief Cadet Office is in the planning stages of the new program and we anticipate a launch very soon.
- Directorships: Outstanding department is: the Master Chief Petty Officer (MCPO). This post is on the VR site and we are compiling the information. We are looking at the current applicants and will have these filled soon.
- We are still progressing looking at the Intellectual Property of the Organization ensuring no infringement on to the Franchise owners. We have been looking first at the STARFLEET and REGIONAL heraldry. I want to thank all the chapters and regions that have worked hard with David Yee to improve our heraldry production.

SFMCA NEWS

From the Desk of the Marine Training Centre Superintendent:

June marks the 1-year anniversary of the closure of TRACOM and the creation of the Marine Training Centre. It was an honor to oversee the transition from the SFMCA to the MTC. It doesn't seem like it's been just a couple months shy of 4 years since I first joined the Academy staff as the Director of Professional Development. These past four years have seen tremendous improvements in the MTC, the biggest being the move from PDF-only courses to 100% QAM compliant courses. It took 9 months and a lot of folks to get the project completed but it was well worth it. Throughout that time, we've seen many courses added and hundreds of students come through the doors. It's been a most rewarding experience.

This June is also bittersweet, as it is my last month as the Superintendent of the Marine Training Centre. As most probably know, I was appointed Commandant, STARFLEET Marine Corps at the beginning of the month. With that appointment, I am stepping down from heading the MTC. But you're not getting rid of me that easily though, not at all. As every Marine knows, PD100, while not a mandatory course per the MFM, is strongly suggested and is, in fact, a prerequisite for all other SFMCA courses. As I stated back in August of 2021, "to be involved in a new Marine's first Academy experience – and making it a good one – is a fun challenge". That's as true today as it was back then. Therefore, with the blessing of both TJ Allen and Jill Rayburn (Chief and Deputy Chief of Educational Services), I am staying on as the Director of Professional Development. I will be available to assist the new Superintendent, whomever that may be, as they get settled in their new role.

I'd be remiss if I didn't take a couple of minutes to thank the folks who helped me out throughout the years. First, to Shane Russell for having faith in me to bring on board to begin with. To TJ and Jill for keeping me on for the transition. To Jayden Tyronian who was so instrumental (and patient!) in helping me get through the QAM conversion. And, of course, to Michael Timko, my Deputy Superintendent and all the Branch Directors over the years who have helped keep the MTC running smoothly. You folks are the best!

With the "so longs" and "farewells" behind me, it's time to move on to my final report...

The STARFLEET Marine Training Centre currently comprises 3 Institutes containing 14 colleges with over 160 available courses.

June saw increased coursework with 128 courses completed successfully. Armor was the most popular course with 20 completed. Professional Development came in second with 19 completed while Infantry finished with 18 total for the month. 13 out of 14 Branches had students, and the most common score was in the Honors range (46%), then Pass (44%), with 10% of the students acing the exams. We welcomed 5 new Marines into the fold.

As reported last month, we've had several people take PD140 but, unfortunately, there is an issue with the database so we can't enter the scores. Please be patient – as soon as it is fixed, the scores will be entered.

All awards and courses (except for PD140) should be up to date. If you think you are missing something on your transcript or don't have an earned certificate, please reach out to whomever takes my place at sfmcasuperintendent@sfi.org and we'll research it and get you what you're owed. If you ever have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask.

Current booking count (room nights): 112 as of 7/1.

Upcoming major expenses: Reimbursement needed for an item purchased for the "swag bags." Receipt has been sent to the CFO and CS. Name badges were purchased in June on CS's credit card.

Additional comments: I continue to post information on Discord and Facebook and answer questions as I receive them.

Meal purchases are not complete yet. The deadline is July 20. We have a \$6,000 food and beverage commitment to meet and I don't think that will be a problem.

July 20 is also the deadline for purchasing tickets for Space Center Houston.

Marines are paying for a bigger room for the Dress Mess. No new or updated contract is needed I was told by the hotel since it's just a room change. The Marines will owe the IC account \$300 plus taxes.

On July 22 I must give the catering manager a final count for meals Friday and Saturday nights.

We still need to order the box lunches for the ECAB meeting onsite attendees.

Major Projects/Efforts

We have a number of things in the works...

- We're revising the process of appointing Brigade OICs. The new process will include more collaboration between Region Coordinators and this office before Brigade OICs are put in place.
- The course requirements for SFMC leadership positions are under review. 17 courses is a bit ridiculous.
- We're opening collaboration with the other Auxiliaries. This begins with personal invitations to the Aux Commanders (or their onsite rep) to attend the SFMC Dress Mess Friday night at IC as the SFMC's honored guests. We'll also be looking at Academy challenges with the other Auxiliaries using both SFA and MTC courses.
- We're reviewing our staffing model to determine what positions need to be retained (are they doing/ have they done anything?) and what needs to be added. We will end up with an active staff, fulfilling the duties of that position.

That about covers things for the moment. Sorry for the length of this first report but we've got a lot going on. Once everything is in place and the major changes are made, things should calm down a bit. But, for now, as I've told folks, "Hold on... It's going to be a fun ride!"

Accomplishments

It's been a pretty busy month since I took over the SFMC. We've already put in several changes.

- The Unit (MSG and BDE) reporting schedules now mirror the Fleet reporting schedule, ending confusion and giving SFMC personnel the same reporting leeway the Naval side gets.
- The SFMC Quartermaster and SFMC Finance Officer positions are being brought back. Requisitions are already posted.
- We've reposted the SGM SFMC position. We're looking for a candidate who wants to be involved. We're looking for a candidate who will set up programs, challenges, and projects specifically done for the Enlisted by the Enlisted.
- Changed the policy about Unit numbers: Going forward, when a new unit is formed, its unit number will continue to be based upon the Brigade it was formed in. Once that unit has been successfully created, the unit number belongs to that unit for as long as it is viable, regardless of where it may relocate. In this way, a unit can create its legacy without fear of losing its numerical identity due to a change of command or location.
- The General Staff is being reworked and new duties assigned. Some of the responsibilities listed aren't relevant any more so we're making some changes:

INFOCOM: Going forward, this department will deal with online content creation - website, social media, newsletters, streaming services, etc. We'll be resurrecting the SFMC newsletter "Attention on Deck". We'll also be doing some website work and refreshing the information there.

FORCECOM: Primarily due to whom COFORCECOM is right now, this department is taking on responsibilities not actually assigned to it. Mike Timko is doing an amazing job on manual design and revisions. He's practically single-handedly designed our look. We've discovered that this is incredibly important stuff to maintain, both as a source of current information and for the training (via the MTC) of our members. And proper maintenance in an ever-changing organization makes this extremely time-consuming. So, Mike Timko will be stepping away from COFORCECOM. There is a requisition out right now for COFORCECOM.

INTELCOM: Mike Timko will be transitioning to this command as COINTELCOM. This new department will be responsible for managing and maintaining SFMC data; data storage; manual creation, maintenance, and updates. One critical duty of INTELCOM will be informing the MTC of any changes in the manuals. Often, in the past, the Marine Academy was informed of policy updates, manual updates, or actual manuals being discontinued by students as they took the courses. Going forward, before any changes are made to any policy and/or manuals, Mike Timko and team will make sure the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent of the Marine Training Centre – and the affected Branch Directors – are informed of the changes and given time to update any affected courses before the changes take place. This will help ensure that the MTC courses reflect the most updated information in their courses.

These General Staff changes will be official once the new COFORCECOM is appointed. The req closes on 8 July.
