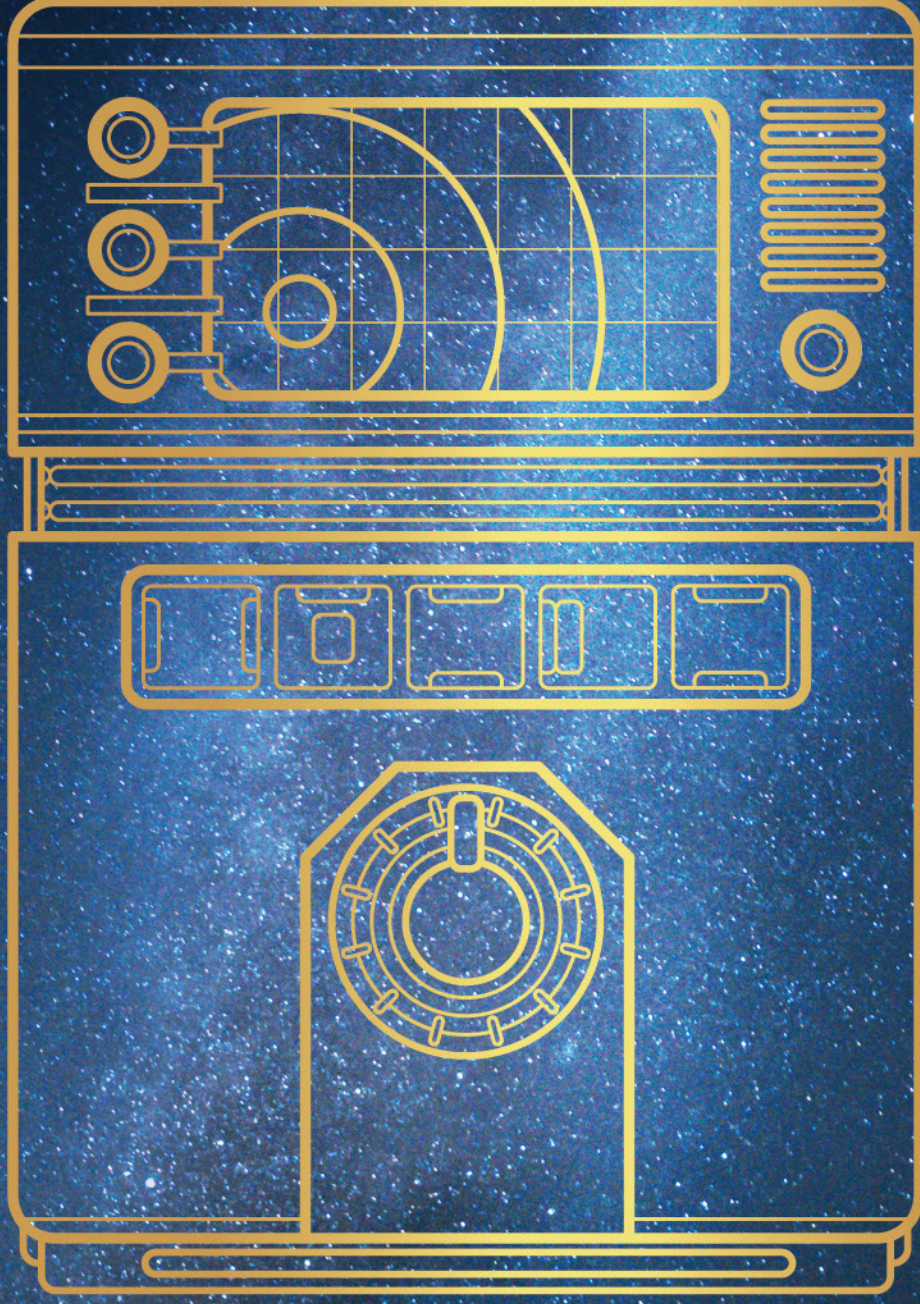

I hope this Command Status Report finds you well and safe.

We continue the progress moving forward to strengthen STARFLEET into the future is going strong with new Committees and new processes. We are working hard going forward for the benefit of SFI with a focus on "new blood". Here is an update on where we are:

As of today, The Administration has these new, completed or is still progressing on:

- We hope to see you August 1-3 in Houston TX for IC 2025. We are still seeking bids for IC 2026. If no bids that meet the frugal attributes of our membership the ECAB meeting will be held via Zoom or Google meet.
- We are in the active process of updating the Style Guide/Intellectual Property Usage and the Member handbook. Both are almost complete and will be made available to all as soon as they are formatted.
- We are in the works on revamping the Membership Data System and hope to have new information by an upcoming report.
- I have asked David Yee our Compliance Officer to begin the creation of an Intellectual Property Course. This will be for any member but will focus on RC's, CO's, XO's, Comms, and any other leadership member in our organization that creates digital or materials that promote SFI and the Franchise. Its goal is to educate all on how to use our Fleet Logo's and the IP of the Franchise holders.
- We have a new CFO and the transition has begun. Please welcome Geoffrey Spon of the USS Cutty Sark to the EC.

More Work Ongoing:

- The Chief Cadet Office is in the planning stages of the new program and we anticipate a launch very soon.
- Directorships: Outstanding department is: the Master Chief Petty Officer (MCPO). This post is on the VR site and we are compiling the information. We are looking at the current applicants and will have these filled soon.
- We are still progressing looking at the Intellectual Property of the Organization ensuring no infringement on to the Franchise owners. We have been looking first at the STARFLEET and REGIONAL heraldry. I want to thank all the chapters and regions that have worked hard with David Yee to improve our heraldry production.
- Beginning June 1 the Election for a new Commander STARFLEET will begin. Note that the Facebook Members only will not have any election materials. All announcements and materials will be made available on the Facebook Business Only Group or by direct Web site that is in process. As a reminder this should not be a vote of who is popular but who can run STARFLEET with a Business mindset for and with Volunteerism.

IC Guide Committee Progress

The IC Guide Committee is finally moving forward and making substantial progress! After some much-needed open discussions, the committee has started working on refining edits to the document, ensuring it will meet the needs and expectations of future International Conferences (and their hosts). They are working closely with the current IC team to gauge what is needed for the document, so we're excited to see how it develops.

Database Committee Update

The *Communique* went out on April 2 as requested by the CS. The CQ was sent out twice actually, once on April 2, and again on April 15 to just those email addresses that had not opened the email the first time. We started doing that second mailing with the last CQ, and it has been successful in increasing the open rate. Together, the rate of emails opened was 62.5%.

The rest of April was a bit slower for the CQ staff as they recovered and began preparation for the next issue. Work on the CQ never really stops. We intend to have a special feature next time in remembrance of Retired FADM Sal Lizard and are encouraging members to send in their pictures and memories of Sal for inclusion. Region 1 just had their Summit, Region 20 will have theirs soon, and we will have coverage from both of those for the next issue (July 1). The Sciences Auxiliary will be featured in the next photo contest. We have had a good response to the poll on TOS guest appearance actors, and might do TNG guest appearance actors for the next one. We always welcome new ideas for the poll.

We have been working with the R20 Comms Chief to improve their access to announcements. Sometimes important information gets “lost” on Facebook because of the number of posts daily, as well as the time difference with R20, so we’ve worked out a method that we believe will help them.

The Public Relations Manager, Assistant Public Relations Manager for the UK, Ireland and Europe, and the PR Assistant, are making progress in efforts to promote and advertise SFI. Sometimes we get a no, as with Starfury in the UK, or the con wants way more money than we are comfortable spending in one place. Clive Burrell and crewmates made an initial appearance at Liverpool Comic Con and we hope the con management will let us do more next year. We should have 2025 pricing soon for Trek Tour (Creation Entertainment) and GalaxyCon. Emails to other cons have been sent and we are hopeful of replies.

The Social Media Services Manager reports that April had a higher increase of STARFLEET members joining the Members Only Facebook group over last month. Over 90% completed all requirements to join by answering the questions correctly. The rest either only partly answered or didn’t answer them at all. He also reports that all posts now have the correct SFI logo on them. Some posts still get rejected for having content not relevant to the group or content that was repetitive of the same material already available.

Our efforts to get BlueSky off the ground, with new staffer Tarae McQueen, has been stymied by the lack of an official email address for Tarae. Over a month has passed since the initial request was submitted via the Help Desk. Two “reminders” have so far failed to get results.

The Pinterest Manager reports that the monthly audience was down in April. Thirty percent of the Pinterest users are in the USA. Slightly more males than females use the site. The age ranges with the most usage remain at 18-24 (23.1%) and 25-34 (24.5%).

The Comms budget for the 2025-2026 fiscal year was submitted prior to the April 1 deadline. Other than an SFI email address for Tarae, we do not have any other needs at this time. The next deadline for CQ articles is June 15. EC members should have their reports submitted by June 5.

SFMCA NEWS

The STARFLEET Marine Training Centre currently comprises 3 Institutes containing 14 colleges with over 160 available courses.

April continued the trend of a slight increase in coursework with 95 courses completed successfully. Infantry was the most popular course with 31 completed. Professional Development came in second with 16 completed while Leadership finished with 10 total for the month. 13 out of 14 Branches had students, and the most common score was in the Honors range [43%], then Honors [40%], with 17% of the students acing the exams. We welcomed 6 new Marines into the fold.

April saw a new course being introduced in the College of Professional Development. There was a bit of confusion over the recent Gallantry Awards submission period. Most of it seemed centered around who can nominate for what and when. This course, PD140 - Awards, covers the awards process. It's not about the awards themselves but the processes around them. We've had several people take it but, unfortunately, there is an issue with the database so we can't enter the scores. Please be patient – as soon as it is fixed, the scores will be entered.

All awards and courses (with the exception of PD140) should be up to date. If you think you are missing something on your transcript or don't have an earned certificate, please reach out to me at sfmcasuperintendent@sfi.org and we'll research it and get you what you're owed. Note from the VCS – I'm happy to report that we have a new CFO and the duties of running SFI's Treasury is mercifully out of my hands. I'll admit that I've already begun to lose access during the turnover and failed to get some of the balances pulled for the CSR before that started – I apologize for that. I'll leave up the numbers from last month's CSR for reference once the new CFO comes fully online into his role.

Of note, the FY25-26 Budget has been given to the AB for vote and should be reported on in a future CSR.

1. Current Resource Allocations: As of April 9, 2025, STARFLEET has a total organizational financial balance of \$167,574.27. This amount includes \$61,151.66 in unrestricted funds and \$103,6784.51 in restricted funds with the following current allocations:

2. Current 12-Month Financial Trends: For the past rolling 12-month period, STARFLEET had a closing balance of \$154,748.62 on April 10, 2024. Exactly one year later at the close of business on April 9, 2025, STARFLEET had a total organizational financial balance of \$167,574.27. This current balance reflects an annual net financial gain of \$12,825.65 (+7.65%) in total organizational resources.

Major Projects/Efforts

As many of you are aware, General Tunis officially stepped down from his position as Commandant of the SFMC effective May 1st. I want to take a moment to thank General Tunis for his dedicated service to the Corps and wish him all the best in his future endeavors. At his request, I will be serving as Commandant through the end of the year, until the new administration takes office in January 2026.

Looking ahead, the remainder of 2025 promises to be a busy and exciting time—especially with the International Conference just around the corner. Soon, Houston will echo with the sounds of combadges and PADDs as STARFLEET: The International Star Trek Fan Association gathers once again. More specifically, we'll be celebrating the contributions and camaraderie of the STARFLEET Marine Corps. I hope you're all making plans to attend.

Lieutenant General Mike Timko and the FORCECOM staff are hard at work updating Corps manuals, reviewing nominations for this year's Honor Awards to be presented at IC, and assisting the Marine Training Center in refining many of our exams.

Major General Jeremy Carsten and the INFOCOM team are developing new training resources for Brigade and Unit OICs and expanding communication efforts across the organization.

General Michael Malotte and the Marine Training Center staff continue to monitor and support Marines undertaking courses to further develop their skills and advance in their respective positions.

"The STARFLEET Marine Training Centre currently comprises 3 Institutes containing 14 colleges with over 160 available courses. April continued the trend of a slight increase in coursework with 95 courses completed successfully. Infantry was the most popular course with 31 completed. Professional Development came in second with 16 completed while Leadership finished with 10 total for the month. 13 out of 14 Branches had students, and the most common score was in the Honors range (43%), then Honors (40%), with 17% of the students acing the exams. We welcomed 6 new Marines into the fold.

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All awards and courses (with the exception of PD140) should be up to date. 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Major Projects/Efforts

As we passed the mid-point of April, STARFLEET Medical continued to build momentum with exciting programming, active engagement, and meaningful recognitions across our divisions. From Earth Day initiatives to new wellness campaigns and a steady stream of training completions, this month underscored our ongoing commitment to education, service, and health across the Fleet.

Medical staff engagement remained strong, with 6 new member registrations via the STARFLEET Medical website, bringing our total registered personnel to 412. No removals were reported this cycle. Our awards

division was equally active, issuing 15 certificates in recognition of service milestones and caregiving contributions—each one a testament to the dedication and compassion within our Medical Corps.

In the area of training, five STARFLEET Medical Certifications and one Interspecies Medical Exchange Program certificate were awarded. Notably, progress within the CORE Medical Training Program remained impressive, with multiple members advancing through the rigorous tiered coursework. Although no new graduates were recorded in either the CORE or SPECIALIST Training Programs this cycle, several Specialist Certifications were earned, reflecting continued dedication to professional development.

A total of 16 training-related certificates were issued, and our Challenge Division saw considerable activity with 134 certificates awarded across the Reading Challenge and the popular Surgeon General's Academy Challenge. Overall, 165 certificates were issued during this reporting period.

While there were no new staff appointments this month, work behind the scenes has been focused on innovation and readiness. Several new awards are prepared for launch, including the Doctor EMH Mk I Award (Medical Historian), the Dr. Bashir Award (Academy Challenges), and the Dr. Culber Award (Wellness Challenges). These new honours will further support our recognition of diverse forms of service within STARFLEET Medical.

Significantly, STARFLEET Medical is proud to announce the official launch of the Permanent Step Challenge, beginning this May. This ongoing wellness initiative invites all members to track their steps, promote health, and compete regionally for top honours. Monthly step reports will be compiled into leaderboards, running totals, and annual awards—offering a fun and motivational way to stay active across the Fleet. Promotional materials, certificates, and a dedicated webpage have all been established in support of this initiative.

This month also featured the highly successful Project Earth Summit, hosted virtually by STARFLEET Auxiliaries. Medical team members participated alongside our colleagues in Science and Petfleet for a day of interactive learning, Federation history, and planetary stewardship. As part of the planning committee, STARFLEET Medical helped shape this unique event celebrating Terra (Sol III) and promoting our shared commitment to sustainability and interspecies cooperation. The event opened promising discussions with companies such as JuliusK9, My LOLA Bear, Kitties With Kapes, and Momoji Pets, among others. These potential collaborations could bring STARFLEET-themed harnesses, collars, apparel, and even custom engraved tags to our members' pets. Talks with Local Paws Magazine may also help beam Petfleet's mission into the homes of pet lovers across the Galaxy.
