

Greetings, Everyone!

First, every one of the unit OICs and DOICs, and the other SFMC members in units in the 1st BDE SFMC deserves a round of thanks and applause for completing the SFDPP RECERT 2025, and/or the SFDPP 101/102 if they had not needed to take the set last year. Congratulations! January will be a crazy month for us each year for the future, in taking foreseeable recertifying ourselves in this set of courses. Most of you know that it is a course we must take to be able to receive sensitive data and use that data as we go forward with planning activities and events each year. Without that set of courses, at this time, you CANNOT take a position of leadership or volunteer for positions that give you access sensitive data.

With that said, let's go into my next point.

Staffing the 1st BDE has been a trial the last year or so, due to the SFDPP requirement. SFMC, and our Brigade, have lost quite a few members from this ANNUAL requirement.

With that said, staff position openings are being submitted to the Human Resources Department and everyone is encouraged to apply. If you DO NOT have the SFDPP required course(s), you would need to take them before starting to work in the role you received. NCOs are also encouraged to apply, in case you didn't notice, brigades run on the career NCO staffing. We should have them in every unit as well as the Brigade staff. Each Unit should also be looking to utilize their NCO positions. Be on the lookout for those staff openings!

At this time, around 18 units have reported in this January 2025 cycle reporting. Three units are most likely decommissioning this cycle, but others are activating. There are almost 40 members that are within chapters without units, whose COs may not realize that they have SFMC members aboard! Chapter COs, note that you may be receiving emails with lists of SFMC members that you have onboard your chapter during the next month, and going forward. As with the SCIENCE TEAMS and OTHER AUXILIARIES, STARFLEET MARINE UNITS bring flavor to your chapter. These programs allow your members to practice leadership and planning, while remaining within your chapters. They encourage teamwork, friendly competition, and comradery. They encourage multi-chapter activities that can be reported on a chapter MSR. Please contact <a href="mailto:sfmc1stbde@sfi.org">sfmc1stbde@sfi.org</a> if you are interested in creating a new SFMC unit.

We also have around 20 SFI members that have no chapter home, unassigned members that could become autonomous units that could report, interact, and gain recognition and ranks by joining either the SFMC or other auxiliaries. 

# Region One Chaplain Corps

**RDC Report-**

Hello, My Fellow First Fleeters,

It hasn't been too long since I was appointed as RDC of R1 Chaplains. Seeing as this RDC program has been out of service for some time, I am basically building from scratch. Thus, there is little to report to the members beyond our reactivation and new online presence in the form of a private Facebook Group; <a href="https://www.facebook.com/groups/sfir1chaplains">https://www.facebook.com/groups/sfir1chaplains</a>.

This group is intended for those members of SFI that are active chaplains in the region, or those with an interest in the program. To join it, you will need to put in a request and answer the membership questions to allow us to verify an active membership in SFI.

As with all other RDCs, participation in the Chaplains RDC is purely voluntary; though I do humbly request any active chaplains in the region to reach out to me either through Facebook Messenger or email at <a href="mailto:emissary.r1.sfi@gmail.com">emissary.r1.sfi@gmail.com</a>.

With all that out of the way, I think it would be beneficial to get in front of some common questions that come up whenever the subject of STARFLEET chaplains arises.

# Are there even any chaplains in *Star Trek*/wasn't Roddenberry an atheist?

This is a two-part question because the answers are connected. Yes, Mr. Roddenberry was an atheist and therefore we have never had an on-screen chaplain. However, the presence of a chapel on the 1701 and *Deep Space Nine* implies that there would have been someone to manage and/or make use of it i.e.: a chaplain. Further, there are a couple references in other Beta Canon sources.

#### Didn't SFI get rid of chaplains?

There was at one time a Chaplains' Services Auxiliary at the fleet level. Due to problems that arose, it was determined that SFI would no longer recognize any auxiliary that had religion as its focus. So, there are no chaplains at the fleet level. However, that determination does not prevent any chapter or region from having chaplains, nor does it prevent a region from establishing a support system to aid them in their efforts to serve the membership—hence this RDC program. Additionally, launching sometime before 1992, Region One's Chaplain Corps RDC predates both the former auxiliary and the subsequent special interest group.

# If this is all just for fun, do we have a need for chaplains?

Yes and no. STARFLEET is intended to be fun. And some chapters either have no need for the position or see where it could be problematic and therefore choose not to have one. Other chapters like having someone in the role. The command staff of a chapter should make such decisions based on what is best for their chapters. This office supports the decisions of the chapters, no matter where they land. It is our goal to support active chaplains, not to see them installed in places where they aren't needed or desired.

#### What does a STARFLEET Chaplain do?

The short answer is that they do only that which the command staff of their chapter or region determines to be their duty. For example, as the de facto chaplain of R1, I will be performing the final mission service at the Region One Summit as well as a just for fun presentation on xeno-religions from an in-universe

perspective.

The long answer being that a chaplain's duties will vary from chapter to chapter. In most cases, they will function more or less like morale officers; supporting those in hard times and celebrating with those who are experiencing something good. Sometimes they will be asked to contribute to their chapter newsletters, and some may even be asked to say a few words to memorialize passings of members or on other more auspicious occasions. In any case, the command staff determines a chaplain's duties—full stop.

# Will chaplains have to perform duties outside of their faith?

As chaplains, we will all have our different traditions and beliefs; we are not expected to betray those beliefs but must respect those of others. This means that our opinions are to be kept to ourselves unless explicitly asked. Even then, if they may be perceived as harmful in any way, they should be kept to ourselves. STARFLEET is a fan organization. We are not expected to act in opposition to our faith. That sometimes means recusing ourselves from a situation, be it a discussion or declining to perform a specific function if it conflicts with our faith. In any case, all things should be done with the utmost respect for those around us.

# Will this program conflict with the inclusivity of SFI?

This really is an exceptionally valid question. While religion is one of the many points that make up the beautiful diversity of the universe, it has also been occasionally used as a weapon against that diversity. For every freedom we have, there will be those who would abuse it. This program will not tolerate bigotry in any form or for any reason. We are here to support,

not proselytize and that should never be forgotten.

There are many more questions than I can answer here. If you have questions about any aspect of this RDC program, please reach out to me. I look forward to serving the First Fleet and will be keeping you all informed of the activities that this RDC is participating in.

SciStarter.org citizen science activities are not part of STARFLEET or Regional One Sciences, though I participate in some of the activities as a private citizen. Below are some of the projects that I have been involved with. I mention them here to show how we can participate in citizen science projects in ways that contribute to scientific research. One of the activities is "Globe at Night." I take a reading of how bright the sky of my location is at about 2100 (9:00pm) with a sky quality meter about once a month. I then post that data on the Globe at Night website after I record it.

As a SKYWARN-trained severe weather spotter, I volunteer for the Meteorological Phenomena Identification Near the Ground (mPING) project. I pick from a list of weather conditions and send a report via the mPING app. I have an official CoCoRaHS rain gauge and can participate in the Community Collaborative Rain, Hail, and Snow Network by reporting data from measurements of rain, hail or snow according to readings of the rain gauge. I also participate in the ISEECHANGE project, reporting observations of the climate in my neighborhood via the ISEECHANGE app, and in the Globe Observer: Clouds program. There I submit observations via Globe Observer app. As a family member



of a veteran, I plan to attend the online event *Do NASA Science LIVE: A special, two-part virtual series for Service Members, Veterans and their Families.* 

I further volunteer for the American Association of Variable Star Observers (AAVSO) by using an AWB OneSky telescope to observe an object on a list of monthly variable stars. Learning how to record data as the star appears brighter or less bright over a period of time is the goal. Learning how to report that data to the AAVSO is the next step. As a SciStarter Ambassador I encourage people to participate in citizen science projects.

# Regional Department Chief (RDC) Operations DESCRIPTION:

Operations can encompass a number of duties that vary from chapter to chapter. In order to establish some common ground and it is suggested by this office that the Operations Officer should be the primarily activities coordinator, proposing and planning things like fundraisers and outings, publicizing events like conventions and movie premiers, and then keeping track of attendance at these events.

Additionally, the Ops Officer would also maintain crew rosters and keep track of memberships to let folks know when they're about to expire. With that, the Ops RDC can work with the Chapter Ops Officers to help with standardization and communicate with the chapters to let them know things such as which Charity Fundraisers have been the most successful or what "Big Events" are going on in their local areas. Of course, this would all be voluntary on the part of the chapters, but even if only one or two chapters participate, it would be a "Value Added" program and would benefit the Region as a whole.

One suggested task for the RDC of Operations is creating a welcome packet for new members in Region One (R1). This should be something that can be given to new members when they come to chapters so they are not overwhelmed during their first months in R1. It can include interviews from current/past members, resources the members can use, and just general information about the chapters and region one. This packet can also be customized at the chapter level.

Another suggested task for the R1 RDC of Operations is to post to Facebook and Discord encouraging discussions about fandom and other aspects of R1 that affect all members of the region. This should be done at least bi-weekly.

#### **OVERALL RDC REQUIRED JOB DUTIES**

How the RDC runs their department is pretty much up to them. However there are certain duties that apply to ALL RDCs. These include:

- o Make your RDC program one that provides value and interest to the region!
- o Monthly reports to the RDC Program Director are due on 1st of every month, the 2nd 5th is considered late and after the 5th is considered failure to report. Missing 2 reports in a row will get the RDC a warning. Missing 3 reports in a calendar year will result in possible dismissal from position. (BUT, the RDC Program Director can be very understanding if they know what they are being understanding about. If circumstances cause you to miss a report or two ... don't wait until you get a warning to call or write and say you have been very busy with something. Instead, you should send a note; e-mail or regular mail saying what is causing you to miss this report before it is due or as soon after it is due as possible).
- o Post to the Region One Facebook Page or Discord AT LEAST every two weeks
- o Stay in contact with those ships who provide you with names and addresses of a contact person. Don't make communication a one way street. After a while your contact person will get tired of sending in reports if they never know if it arrived or not. When you get a report, let the person reporting know. Send a recent photo of yourself if you are chosen for the RDC webpage.

# Regional Department Chief (RDC) of Diplomatic Officers

The Regional Department Chief (RDC) of Diplomatic Officers is entrusted with the creation and maintenance of a comprehensive knowledge database, detailing effective recruiting techniques and practices. Additionally, the RDC will engage with non-SFI fan groups within the R1 area, publicizing joint events and operations to enhance regional visibility and cooperation.

### RDC of Uniforms and Costuming

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

The role of the Regional Department Chief (RDC) of Uniforms and Costuming is crucial to our community, serving as the primary resource for all things related to Star Trek costumes and uniforms. This includes both pre-made and custom options, as well as expertise in sourcing materials and offering guidance on creating costumes and accessories.

While the primary focus is on Star Trek, the RDC must also possess a broad understanding of other Sci-Fi, Cosplay, and Steampunk genres. Experience from previous conventions will significantly enhance the effectiveness and



insight this role brings.

The RDC is responsible for maintaining active and engaging presences on Facebook, Discord, and other social media platforms. Regular posts—on a weekly or bi-weekly basis—are essential to keep these channels vibrant and foster communication and collaboration within our costuming community.

Additionally, the RDC should make it a priority to reach out to new chapters within Region One shortly after their establishment. Providing timely assistance and guidance will ensure that our members, whether seasoned or new to costuming, receive the support they need.

Your work will be instrumental in ensuring that our region's visual identity remains unified, professional, and consistently impactful.
